(To be awarded to an AFFILIATED UNION)

Bea Kersten had a long and rich history of serving the community through her volunteer contributions. She was a member of IBEW Local 1139. This award was established in 1986 to honor an *affiliated union* who made unique contributions to their communities through volunteer service and to focus public attention on these outstanding and innovative volunteer efforts.

TERREL D. MERRIMAN COMMUNITY SERVICES AWARD

(To be awarded to an INDIVIDUAL union member)

During his life, Terrel Merriman, a member of CWA 7200, championed the rights of the little person and support to anyone in need through his volunteer activities. This award was established in 1988 to honor an *individual* who made unique contributions to their communities through volunteer service and to focus public attention on these outstanding and innovative volunteer efforts.

MINNESOTA AFL-CIO YOUTH VOLUNTEER AWARD

(To be awarded to a young union member or dependent of a union member, age 17-21)

This award was established in 2003 to honor a young union member or dependent of a union member, who made unique contributions to their communities through volunteer service and to focus public attention on these outstanding and innovative volunteer efforts.
